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Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise money and what sum, for the maintenance of State Highway, State Aid Highways within the limits of said town under Sections 8 and 17, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Special Resolve Maintenance under Chapter 124, P. L. 1927.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise \$658.00 for the maintenance third class roads, in order for the town to be entitled to third class apportionment, under the provisions of Section 4, Chapter 260, P. L. 1929.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise money to provide for the services of a County Health Nurse, and how much.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to accept (\$100.00) one hundred dollars in trust from E S. Wood Est., the income to be used for the maintenance and perpetual care of said lot in Highland Cemetery.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to accept (\$100.00) one hundred dollars in trust from the Ulrich Hawes Est., the income to be used for the maintenance and perpetual care of said lot in Horseback Cemetery.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to accept (\$100.00) one hundred dollars in trust from Rose H. Leighton, the income to be used for the maintenance and perpetual care of Newcomb Lot in Highland Cemetery.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to accept (\$100.00) one hundred dollars in trust from A. H. Luce, the income to be used for the maintenance and perpetual care of the Henry W. Luce lot in North Carmel Cemetery.

Art 25 To see if the town will vote to accept (\$100.00) one hundred dollars in trust from N. I. Winslow, the income to be used for the maintenance and perpetual care of Mrs. Carolne A. Winslow lot in Highland Cemetery.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to reimburse G. A. DeRusha, Perley Hewes, Norman Whitney and the Hardwood Product Co., whole or part of tax on buildings destroyed by fire, in 1930.

Art. 27. To see what action the town will take in regard to the removal of snow the coming winter, and raise money for the same.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise \$1,000.00) one thousand dollars to reimburse the town treasurer and pay Dr. D. W. Sheldon balance due him.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to raise (\$2,000.00) to pay balance of temporary loan at Merrill Trust Co.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money necessary for town expenses in anticipation of taxes; and transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting, and raise money for the same.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the Town Hall in said town at nine-thirty o'clock in the forenoon of said meeting.

# Principal's Report, Carmel High School

The time is coming, and now is, when the boy or girl, young man or young woman, who has not at least a high school training will have a very undesirable handicap in the race for success in life. For this reason high schools must not be wholly those which are established in cities or large towns. Such schools are already overcrowded, and are not within easy range of boys and girls in most country places. Moreover, such schools are not the most desirable for country boys and girls to attend. Costly buildings, elaborate equipment, and large classes pass current with most people as being the sure indicators of success. No greater fallacy was ever invented. Nobody needs a large building in which to teach, think, or recite. Large numbers, though attractive to some boys and girls chiefly for having a good time, tend to work against the concentrated thinking needed to master high school subjects. Large classes make individual instruction impossible, and the teacher's efforts are divided among so many that the amount to each is minified. The country high school, therefore, rightly maintains its place, and the teachers in such a school get into much closer and helpful relations with the pupils than can possibly be brought about in the larger high schools.

The Carmel High School contains a purposeful and well-disposed group of boys and girls bent on securing a high school training, and eager to learn. Good-will prevails and work is being done such as prescribed by the State of Maine for the class A high schools. Both the building and the equipment might be better, but neither of these can detract from the efficiency of the work done. Our work in athletics has been abundant, and has given the boys and girls opportunity for healthful exercise and development. The larger high schools have more to select from, and so have better chance to put winning teams in the field; but to win always is not the great object of athletics. In the league of high schools hereabout formed to have the schools of nearly the same size compete, our boys have won one more game than they have lost, and there is one game yet to play.

We are thankful to have the help of the Simpson Memorial Library, which is within easy distance from our high school, as it makes possible the advantages of reading and reference work which we might not have otherwise. The cordiality and eagerness to help

which the managers of this library tender to us are well appreciated. This library has also given our high school this school year a full set of the American Cyclopaedia and a full set of the Johnson's Encyclopaedia. These form a valuable fund of ready information, and it is pleasing to see the eagerness with which our boys and girls consult these in their work.

Food, shelter, clothing and education are now by law considered to be the natural birthright of all boys and girls. We cannot and should not deny or curtail any of these which are so necessary to make good, intelligent, and useful citizens.

In closing I wish to thank our genial and helpful Superintendent, Mrs. Carter, the Board of Education, the Library Association, and all others who are contributing so eagerly and helpfully to make the present school year a success.

### TEACHERS

At the end of the 1930 school year, the following teachers were elected to take place of those who resigned: Miss Ruby Partridge, Horseback School; Miss Ellen Perry, Hinckley Hill; Miss Dorothy Perry, Partridge School; Mrs. Elizabeth Preble was transferred to Damascus School. The large registration at the grade building made it necessary to hire a teacher for the grammar grades. Mrs. Frances Goodwin, who was elected, resigned at the end of the fall term and Miss Idona Cole was elected to take her place. The primary grades are taught by Mrs. Phyllis Newcomb and the intermediate by Mrs. Edna Burrill.

In general, the teachers have worked conscientiously and well, and the children have made excellent progress.

### REPAIRS

The repairs made this year were for the most part of a minor nature. The toilets will require a number of repairs soon in order that they may be kept in a sanitary condition. The chemical toilet at the

Horseback School must be attended to at regular intervals and due to the cost of chemicals, this involves some expense.

Some interior painting and papering should be done at Horseback and Hinckley Hill schools. The blackboards in nearly all the schools are in poor condition. This can be corrected at comparatively small expense.

### HIGH SCHOOL

The High School has made excellent progress this year under the able leadership of Mr. Rice, assisted by Miss Oliver. The registration at the beginning of the year was fifty-eight, of which fourteen were non-resident.

The high school account shows a substantial balance and with an equal or greater registration this year we shall be able to make some needed improvements on the building. Parents are urged to visit the high school more frequently and thus gain a clear understanding of the progress made by the students.

### WHITTAKER FUND

The Whittaker Fund has remained thus far unexpended. This is the remainder of the five hundred dollars given by Miss Flora Whittaker at the time of purchase of this high school building, for improvements of building or grounds. It has been suggested that this amount be used to erect a suitable name-plate or sign with the name "Whittaker High School" in order to show proper appreciation for Miss Whittaker's generous gift.

One of the requirements for the standard courses of study in a "Class A" high school is a library. Through the generosity of Simpson Memorial Library the students have access to the reference books and other books necessary to their courses. This is very much appreciated by both teachers and pupils. I wish to thank the trustees of the Library for their interest and co-operation with the school department.
