To L. D. French, Constable of Carmel, in said County,

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Carmel, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall in said town on Monday, March first, A. D. 1937, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To elect Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To elect a Town Clerk.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the reports of the municipal officers as printed.
- Art. 4. To elect three or more Selectmen, Assessors, and Overseers of the Poor.
- Art. 5. To elect a Town Treasurer.
- Art. 6. To elect one or more members of the Superintending School Committee.
- Art. 7. To elect a Collector of Taxes, and fix his compensation.
- Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to elect a Road Commissioner or authorize the Selectmen to act as Road Commissioners.

Art. 9. To elect a Road Commissioner if the town so votes in the preceeding article.

Art. 10. To elect a Fire Warden, Sextons, Surveyors of Wood, Bark and Lumber; Fence Viewers, Tramp Constable, and Town Agent.

Art. 11. To fix the compensation of our several officers: First Selectman, Second Selectman, Third Selectman, Assessors, and Overseers of the Poor, Road Commissioner, Superintending School Committee, Fire Warden, and raise money for the same.

Art. 12. To elect one or more Town Constables.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following purposes:

Art. 14. To see what action the town will take in regard to the removal of snow, the coming winter, purchase equipment, and raise money for the same.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to state aid as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 28, of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate for State Aid Road Construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes, 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 173, P. L. 1935.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid Account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid Roads, in excess of the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 132, P. L. 1935.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Special Resolve maintenance under Chapter 124, P. L. 1927.

Art. 19. To see if the town will raise the sum of \$571.68 for the maintenance of third class roads, in order for the town to be entitled Third Class Apportionment under the provisions of the amendments of Section 5, suspending Section 46 of Chapter 175, P. L. 1933.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 to be expended on the Fuller Road, so-called, beginning at the so-called John Smith place and extending to the John Hughes place, so-called, for the purpose of keeping up so-called road.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the purpose of improving the Horse Back Road, so-called, beginning at Garland's store, so-called, extending to the Levant town line.

Art. 22. To see what wages the town will pay for trucks, teams, and men working on highway this coming year, also for men working on school house repairs.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$809.81 to defray the expense of the town's share of the W. P. A. Bridge Project used for material.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$67.00 or more for school nursing in the town of Carmel under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare.

Art. 25. To see what sum the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the toilets at the Town Hall in Carmel.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Treasurer to deduct 25% or more from all wages of town employees, also on supplies and material furnished the town, the same to be applied to taxes.

Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of reducing the town indebtedness.

Art. 28. To see what action the town will take in regard to Daylight Saving Time in the Town of Carmel.

Art. 29. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow from any bank or persons in the State of Maine, as a temporary loan or loans, to and for the use of the Town of Carmel, in anticipation of the taxes for the year 1937, sums of money in the aggregate not to exceed six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00) and fix the rate of interest for same, and authorize the Treasurer of the town to execute the negotiable note or notes therefor, payable within the time specified.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the improvement of the H. H. Swett Road, so-called, beginning at the Cook Road, so-called, and extending to the H. H. Swett residence.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to reimburse Harold Brown \$102.00 for conveyance furnished in 1935-36, the same to be applied on taxes due from estate of B. R. Brown.

Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to install a heating system in the high school building, and raise money for same.

Art. 33. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate to be expended on the Ash Hill Road, so-called.

Art. 34. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the payment of interest on old notes. \$500.00 recommended.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to elect an Excise Tax Collector.

Art. 36. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting, and raise money for the same.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the Town Hall at nine-thirty o'clock in the forenoon of said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Carmel:

I herewith submit the annual report of the schools of Carmel for the municipal year ending February 15, 1937.

TEACHERS

Village, Grades VI, VII, VIII—Horace Dodson, principal, enrollment 33 pupils.

Village, Grades III, IV, V—Eva H. Bennett, enrollment 35 pupils.

Village, Grades S. P., I, II—Phyllis Newcomb, enrollment 46 pupils.

Partridge School—Elizabeth Preble, enrollment 22 pupils.

Hinckley Hill—Dorothy Perry, enrollment 15 pupils.

Damascus—Ethel Underhill, enrollment 25 pupils.

Horseback—Arline Hall, enrollment 34 pupils.

All of our teachers have had normal school training and experience. Five are graduates of our Maine normal schools. Mr. Dodson has proved to be a very efficient principal, ably assisted by Miss Bennett and Mrs. Newcomb.

Both Mrs. Newcomb and Miss Hall of the Horseback school have had an over-crowded condition in their schools. In spite of this handicap, good results have been obtained. I believe that all of our teachers are showing a most excellent attitude toward their school work.

TEXT-BOOKS

Our schools are fairly well supplied with modern text-books. Reference material, supplementary text-books and maps are needed. We are grateful to Simpson Memorial Library for the constant cooperation and courtesy shown to the school department.

REPAIRS

The shingling of the Horseback school was completed this year, a new black-board installed and new shades bought. One new black-board was bought for the Partridge school. Minor repairs were made at the other school houses.

The lighting condition at the Partridge school is very poor. Since new windows must be bought, it would seem to be an economical measure to install standard lighting, (glass area 1-5 the floor area) from the rear or left of the pupils.

The foundation of the high school building must be made safe this year. New sills are needed and the building is not safe under present conditions. This past year a start was made toward making much-needed improvement in the sanitary arrangements. A septic tank was installed with drain-tile laid to cesspool. The water pipe was laid from the grammar school well. One rest room was remodeled, a back stair-way built, and acid-proof pipe bought for the laboratory. The installation of a modern heating system would add greatly to the comfort of the students.

ORGANIZATIONS

The school department appreciates the interest and cooperation of the following organizations: The American Legion, the Parent-Teacher Association, and Simpson Memorial Library.

HIGH SCHOOL

Mr. Ingalls and Miss Oliver have shown their usual professional ability and spirit in the high school work this year.

Although we have had a smaller number of tuition students, our enrollment is high for a two-teacher school. An attempt has been made to adapt instruction to the individual by a more enriched curriculum, and by linking extra-curricular activities to those of the curriculum.

Mr. Ingalls showed his interest in professional advancement by attending summer school at the University of Maine.

In general, I feel that work of our high school is on a high level for a small school.

In closing, I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the S. S. Committee, town officers, teachers, pupils and citizens who have given kindly cooperation in my work.

REPORT OF HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

To the Superintendent and Superintending School Committee:

I herewith submit my report as Principal of Carmel High School.

For the school year ending January 28, 1937, the percent of attendance was 94.17 which is very satisfactory. The enrollment has remained fairly steady between fifty and fifty-five for the fall term and by classes is as follows:

A study of this table will show a high percent of failure in the Freshman year and a constant progress thereafter. This is evidence that the gap between the elementary and secundary years is a wide one and most difficult for the majority to cross and is an argument in favor of the six-year system which would tend to reduce this mortality. We are thus maintaining a high standard of work at the expense of what may be the best interests of a majority of our first-year students. Thus many pupils drop out of school during or after the first year when, in a six-year organization, they might progress steadily to graduation. However, those who do repeat the work of the Freshman year are almost sure to show improvement and steady progress.

We are putting less emphasis on interscholastic athletics and hope eventually to evolve a plan whereby more of the student body will take part in the physical education program. Also, the foundation for a permanent musical organization has been made and the whole extra-curricula program should be broadened to include all pupils in some such activity.

The repairs and improvements which were begun on the school building constituted a splendid move toward the attainment of some much-needed changes in the plant.

I wish to thank the American Legion for their contribution of ten dollars, making possible the attendance of five boys at the Young People's Conference at Waterville.

Miss Oliver is doing excellent work and is planning a much needed reorganization of the English department, grading the work to meet the ability of the first year pupils.

I wish to thank Mrs. Carter, the School Committee, Mr. Elsmore and the elementary teachers for their constant cooperation. Also, the Rev. Mr. Ballou and Mrs. Ballou for their work with the young people, which is a valuable supplement to the school program.

I urge all interested citizens to visit the school and inspect our work.
