

TOWN WARRANT

State of Maine

To L. D. French, Constable of Carmel, in said County,

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Carmel, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall in said town on Monday, March 30th, A. D. 1942, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To elect a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To elect a town clerk.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the reports of the municipal officers as printed.

Art. 4. To elect three or more selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor.

Art. 5. To elect a town treasurer.

Art. 6. To elect one or more members of the superintending school committee.

Art. 7. To see if the town will elect a road commissioner or authorize the selectmen to act as road commissioners.

Art. 8. To elect a road commissioner if the town so votes in the preceding article.

Art. 9. To elect a fire warden; sextons; surveyors of wood, bark and lumber; fence viewers; tramp constable and town agent.

Art. 10. To fix the compensation of our several officers. First selectman; second selectman; third selectman; assessors; overseers of the poor; road commissioner; superintending school committee; town treasurer; fire warden and raise money for the same.

Art. 11. To elect one or more town constables.

Art. 12. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate, for the following purposes:

Snow Fence

Common School

Insurance on School Buildings

Fire Equipment (Grammar Building)

High School

300 Schoolhouse Repair

Salary of Superintendent

Interest on Common School Fund

Memorial Day

Care of Cemeteries

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand, two hundred thirty-six dollars and twenty-five cents (\$1,236.25) the amount due for the bonded indebtedness of the town, including interest for the current year.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate to the Carmel School District the sum of one thousand, nine hundred seventy-one dollars and twelve cents (\$1,971.12) the amount due for School District Bonds including interest for the years 1940-41 and 1941-42.

Art. 15. To elect a Collector of Taxes and fix his compensation.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate for state aid construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930 or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise money, and what sum for the maintenance of State and State Aid highways within the limits of said town under Sections 8 and 17, Chapter 25 of Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for special resolve maintenance, under Chapter 124, Public Laws 1927.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$532.00 for the maintenance of third class roads, in order for the town to be entitled to third class apportionment under the provisions of the amendments of Section 46 of Chapter 175, Public Laws of 1933.

Art. 20. To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$90.00 for public health nursing in Carmel. Said sum to be expended by the State Bureau of Health, for local service.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of (\$25.00) for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions under the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 82 of the Revised Statutes. Said sum to be expended through th State of Maine Publicity Bureau.

Art. 22. To see if the town will raise the sum of \$100.00 for the maintenance of the Fuller Road so called, beginning at the Five Road, so called and extending to the John Hughes place, so called.

Art. 23. To see if the town will accept the sum of \$50.00 in trust from Wilbur F. Otis, the income to be used for the maintenance and perpetual care of the Winfield, H and Etta R. Hodsdon lot in Highland Cemetery, after Wilbur F. Otis ceases to care for same.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to close Partridge, Hinkley Hill, Damascus, No. Carmel schools, and transport scholars to Village school.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to purchase a school bus and raise money for the same.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from the estate of Calvin Hafford, in trust, the income to be used for the care of the Hafford lot in Highland Cemetery.

Art. 27. To see if the town will raise the sum of \$17.40 to reimburse the Estate of Everett W. Garland; \$46.40 to

reimburse E. S. Drew for buildings destroyed by fire in 1940; \$34.50 to reimburse C. U. Hewes for buildings and machinery destroyed by fire in 1941.

Art. 28. To see what wages the town will vote to pay for trucks, teams, and men working for the town, the coming year.

Art. 29. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to deduct from the wages of all town employees a percentage of the same, to be applied on taxes, and fix the rate.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen, on behalf of the town, to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on payment of cash and to execute quit claim deeds for such property, or to take any other legal action necessary to acquire possession of and sell said property.

Art. 31. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Civilian Defense.

Art. 32. To see what action the town will take in regard to the old high school building.

Art. 33. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to borrow from any bank or persons in the State of Maine, as a temporary loan or loans, to and for the use of the Town of Carmel in anticipation of taxes for the year 1942, sums of money in the aggregate not to exceed three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) and fix the rate of interest of the same, and authorize the treasurer of the town to execute the negotiable note or notes therefor, payable within the time specified.

Art. 34. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the Town Hall at nine o'clock in the forenoon of the day of said meeting.

REPORT OF HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

To Superintendent Bertha Carter, Members of the School Committee, and Citizens of the Town of Carmel:

On submitting my first annual report as principal of Carmel High School, I wish, first of all, to extend my most sincere appreciation to all citizens who have helped the school in many ways since the opening of the school year.

Our school opened September the second with an enrollment of seventy-three students, distributed as follows:

Since the opening of school, the enrollment has dropped to the present number of sixty-six students. The present teachers are Robert B. Merrill, principal and teacher of science and mathematics, Robert Kinney, teacher of English, languages, and history, and Lillian Carver, teacher of bookkeeping, typewriting, business arithmetic and economic geography. Three courses of study are offered—namely, college preparatory, general, and commercial. The courses have been revised slightly. The college course is to offer two years of algebra instead of one in order to meet the requirement of the college entrance board, the general course is to offer one year of typewriting and one year of business arithmetic, and the commercial course offers two years of typewriting, and one each of bookkeeping, business arithmetic, salesmanship, commercial law, economics, junior business training, and economic geography.

In answer to many questions regarding the commercial

course, the six typewriters in the school at present necessarily limits the number of students who can take the course in any one year, advanced bookkeeping will not be offered as it is mostly a theory course, whereas the present course is the practical course which should fit students to handle the bookkeeping of a small business, and such courses as filing, shorthand, and office practice cannot be offered due to the great expense involved in the equipment for such courses. The present course coincides with the general commercial course set up by the State Department of Education.

The general tone of discipline in the school is very satisfactory; the students as a whole seem willing to work for the best interests of the school. The most serious problem that we have to face is that of attendance; our school ranks very low in this respect in comparison with other schools of equal size. The tardiness and absence figures are very high for some reason. It seems that with a new school in town, we should all cooperate in an attempt to improve this situation. The school earnestly wishes to help each student obtain a good education, but it is impossible to do this if a student is absent or tardy too often without good reason. The school can not do much for a student if he is not present at the school. We are only too glad to cooperate if a student is ill or is needed at home, but do not feel that a child should be kept out of school for other reasons. Let us all, for the good of our children, cooperate in making this attendance record better.

The athletic situation is quite encouraging at the school with a large percentage of students taking part in the sports. A cross country team was organized this fall, with Carmel winning three out of four interscholastic meets and placing third in the Central League cross country meet. It is hoped that this sport can be expanded another fall to include more boys and more meets. About forty students stayed for basketball this winter and were organized into

three teams, a junior varsity, girls', and boys' team. The girls' team has been repeating its excellent performance of last year and the material indicates a good team for two more years. The boys' team, in spite of inexperience, has succeeded in winning a few games. With the same boys returning another year and the experience they have gained this year, next year's team should show a definite improvement. It is hoped that Carmel High School can enter the Central League in baseball this spring and we hope to organize a girls' softball league among the nearby schools.

My only recommendations are that adequate fire protection be provided for the new school, a heavy insurance against fire be carried on the school and its furnishings, and that the maps, science equipment, and library facilities be expanded. In the new school, if a fire of any size were to break out, we should be entirely without the necessary equipment to cope with it. Small bomb extinguishers should be placed throughout the building with about seventy feet of one and one-half inch fire hose with an outlet pipe in a closet in the central part of the building. It would indeed be a tragedy if our new building were to be partly or even wholly destroyed by fire and without adequate insurance.

Expressing my appreciation to the superintendent of schools, members of the school committee, students, fellow teachers, and the townspeople for their constant cooperation with the school, I submit this report as the principal of Carmel High School.

The teachers of Carmel are devoted to the best interests of their schools. In these times when many teachers are going into war industries, it is becoming increasingly difficult to obtain good teachers. The people of Carmel should make every effort to retain their present staff, if possible.

CONVEYANCE

Considerable interest has been shown in buying a bus for conveyance to the village schools. This would effect a certain amount of saving over a period of years and would

probably mean a larger amount of state aid. It would mean that three schools outside the village would be closed. Bus conveyance has apparently been successful in neighboring towns but has some disadvantages, especially in winter. Tire and gasoline rationing will make all types of conveyance a real problem this year.

TEXTBOOKS

This account was kept within a minimum sum this year. New science books were bought for the eighth grade. The basic reading system was completed for the first three grades. A small but adequate reference library can be bought at a cost of approximately \$16 per school. We hope to add these during the spring term. Rising costs of paper and supplies of all kinds will make it necessary to increase the textbook and supply budget for 1942-43.

REPAIRS

When it became necessary to remain in the old high school building for the fall and winter terms, repairs had to be made in order that the commercial students could have a separate room. This was done with a minimum of expense to the town. Repairs for other schools included items for the furnace at the grammar school building, repairs to flush closets, and the making of heavy wire screens to protect the glass of the basement windows. Repairs to the four buildings outside of the village were of a minor nature. A new stove is needed at Hinckley Hill school.

HIGH SCHOOL

Principal Merrill has given an excellent summary of the work and extra-curricular activities of the high school in his report. I wish to add that the citizens of Carmel should be very proud of their fine new modern building. I believe that by this building, they have made an investment for the

youth of the present and of the future that they will never regret.

RECOMMENDATIONS

After carefully considering all items, the S. S. Committee and I recommend the following appropriations for schools:
