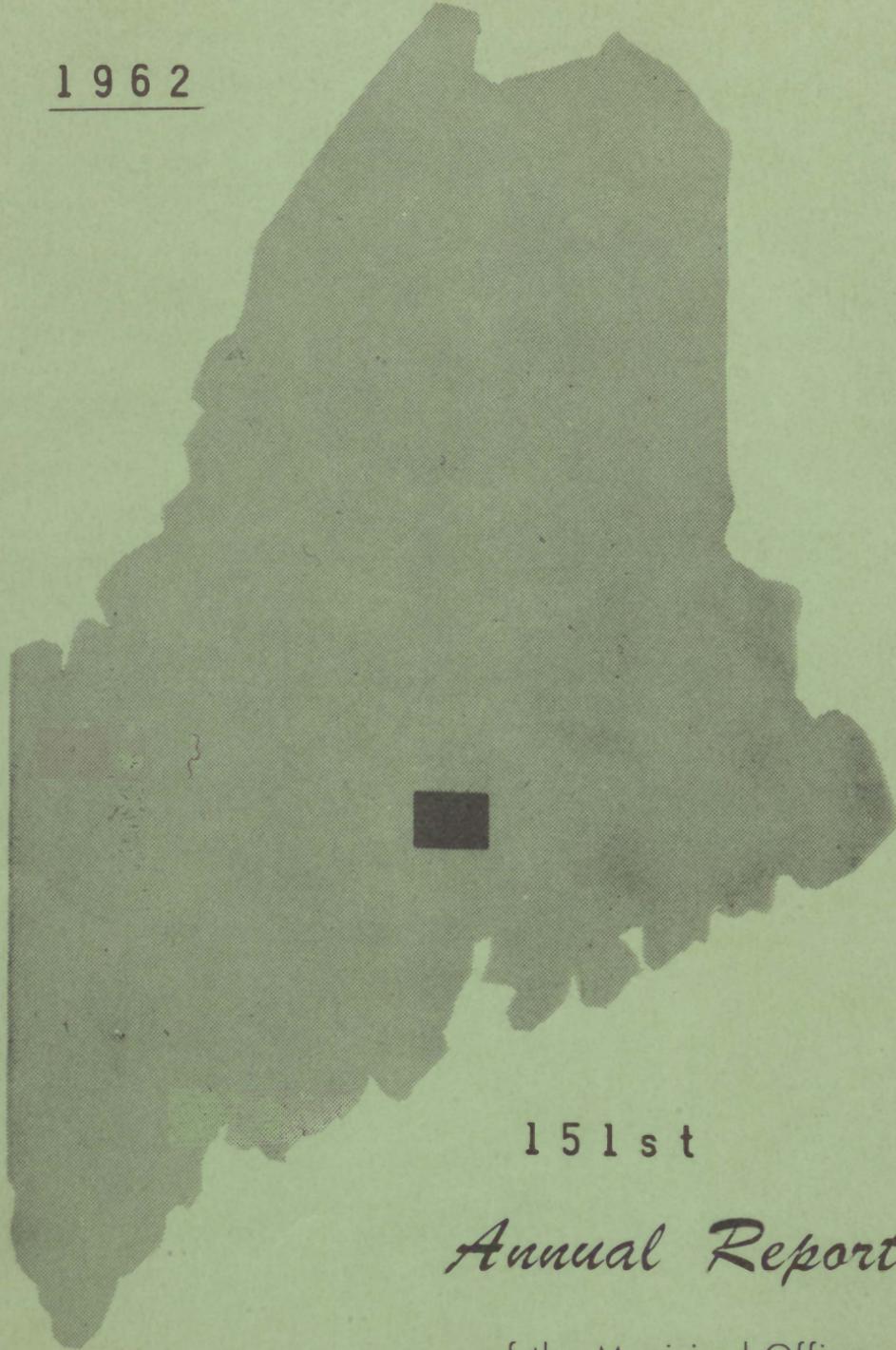

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS**ESTATE DISTRIBUTED**

When the estate of persons deceased have been distributed during the past year, or have changed hands from any cause, the Executor, Administrator, or other interested persons, are hereby warned to give notice of such change, and in default of such notice will be held under law to pay the tax assessed although such estate has been wholly distributed and paid over.

RESIDENT OWNERS

All inhabitants of the Town of Carmel, Maine, and all Administrators, Executors, Trustees, etc., of all estates taxable in said town of such persons are hereby notified to **MAKE AND BRING IN TO THE ASSESSORS TRUE AND PERFECT LISTS OF THEIR POLLS AND ALL THEIR ESTATES, REAL AND PERSONAL**, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the first day of April 1962 and be prepared to make oath to the truth of the same and to answer all proper inquiries in writing as to the nature, situation, and value of their property liable to be taxed.

PERSONS DOOMED

Any resident owner who neglects to comply with this notice is hereby barred of his right to make application to the **ASSESSORS** or the **COUNTY COMMISSIONERS**, for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such list with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed.

NOTICE TO VETERANS DESIRING EXEMPTIONS

No exemptions on polls and estates shall be allowed in favor of any person who is not a legal resident of the State of Maine; and provided that any male or female veteran, or blind person, who desires to secure exemption shall, on or before the first day of April, notify in writing the assessors where he or she resides, and furnish proof of entitlement, and thereafter said assessors shall grant such exemption while so qualified. (Chap. 91-A Revised Statutes)

Note: The polls and estates of all persons who by reasons of infirmity or poverty are in the judgment of the assessors unable to contribute toward the public charges are exempt. (Chap. 91-A, Revised Statutes)

LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

To the Citizens and Taxpayers

Submitted herewith is the Selectmens financial report for the 1962 fiscal year. The report includes all appropriation accounts excepting the poor accounts which appear in the report of the Overseers of the Poor. It does not include the ledger or bookkeeping accounts.

The report is composed of two separate parts. First is a presentation of all the accounts showing credits and charges, and to whom monies were paid. The second part is a detail of six accounts showing what services or materials were purchased. Those accounts which are self-explanatory are omitted from the second part.

This type of report is considered unnecessary by some and is frequently discouraged. Certainly in larger communities it would be virtually impossible. However, because our Town is small, our accounts few, and because we feel that this type of report is what most people want, it is with pleasure that we submit this, our report for the year 1962.

Carmel Volunteer Fire Department

To the Citizens of Carmel:

During 1962 this Department was called upon to fight a total of forty eight fires. Of this number ten were chimney fires, two were flooded oil burner fires, four chicken house fires, fifteen grass and woods fires, and seventeen were of a miscellaneous nature. The locations of these fires were as follows: thirty five in Carmel, nine in Etna, two in Hermon, and one each in Hampden and Newburg.

The Department will accept shipment of a new 800GPM International Tank Truck during March of this year. We wish to thank the people of Carmel for providing us with this equipment. The truck was purchased with the proceeds of eight promissory notes of \$1,200 denomination. The department has requested that its annual appropriation of \$2,500 be reduced to \$1,300 and the remainder be used to pay the principal of one note each year. In this way the increased cost to the Town over the eight year period will be \$192 per year, the interest on the notes.

A new policy of keeping a member of the Department on call in the fire station during the night has been initiated. The members have responded well. This will enable us to answer night calls more quickly, and in saving minutes at the outset when minutes are important, give better fire protection to the community.

There is now a Civil Defense radio in the fire station which is manned on Wednesday evenings, and which provides immediate communication with County Headquarters in Orono. The members have painted the interior of the fire station during the winter.

Once again we wish to thank the men who operate the department, the ladies auxiliary which works so hard, and the townspeople who support us through the year.

The purpose of public health nursing is to help individuals and families to apply in their daily lives information that science has developed for healthful living, for correction of physical defects or for convalescence from illness.

The public health nurse participates in such community measures for the prevention of disease as community immunization clinics, school health examinations and child health conferences.

To these programs, the members of the committees have made a most valuable contribution by their able assistance.

Many of the services that have been given by your public health nurse do not lend themselves to statistical tabulation. Because of her continuing contact with individuals and families in their homes, in the school and in the community she has the opportunity to act as a health counselor. Every phase of the health program involves her in some way. In her home visiting she sees the family as a whole. Accurate observation and knowledge of the home situation and family attitudes enables the nurse to better relate her teaching to needs. Activities include (1) giving or teaching nursing care and rehabilitation care, under the direction of the family physician; (2) guidance to mothers before and after the birth of their children; (3) interpreting community and State facilities to patients and encouraging them to use these facilities intelligently; and (4) working with other professions and community health groups in studying, planning and putting into action community health programs.

Your public health nurse would appreciate being notified of any health problems within families of your community where she could be of service.

COMMENTS

TOWN OF CARMEL

FEBRUARY 1, 1962 TO JANUARY 31, 1963

An audit of the financial records of the Town of Carmel has been completed for the fiscal year ended January 31, 1963. The audit consisted of an examination of the records maintained by the Town Manager and municipal officials.

The operations for the year showed that the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed amounted to \$4,900.83, per the following summary:

The balance of excise tax, town poor, and town road tar accounts were the major factors contributing to the amount lapsed to surplus.

* * * *

The following comments pertain to the accompanying financial statements and to the scope of audit.

ASSETS The general cash balance of \$510.30 was on deposit in the Merrill Trust Company, Bangor, Maine. The petty cash fund of \$50.00 was on hand with the tax collector.

Accounts receivable of \$17.95 consisted of current charges for State welfare cases.

Taxes receivable totaling \$16,283.62 included for the most part unpaid current year accounts of \$15,770.86. The remaining balance of \$512.76 was for uncollected prior years' taxes for the 1958, 1959 and 1960 years.

Tax liens amounted to \$4,309.19 at the year end.

LIABILITIES, RESERVES AND SURPLUS The unpaid portion of tax anticipation loan was \$8,000.00 at the end of the fiscal year.

The appropriation accounts showed a net unexpended balance of \$1,211.59 in the state aid road account which was carried forward to the ensuing year in accordance with legal requirements.

The ministerial and school fund of \$1,605.00, which was used by the town in prior years, is shown as due trust funds. Interest at 4% was provided by appropriation and made available to the school department.

The Simpson Memorial Library Fund of \$1,000.00 was uninvested and due the trust fund account at the close of the year. A cemetery perpetual care fund of \$100.00 is reserved pending acceptance by the town.

Trust funds accepted or pending acceptance by the townspeople should be deposited or invested in accordance with statutory provisions.

The unappropriated surplus amounted to \$9,231.37, a decrease of \$2,426.17 for the year. The change was occasioned principally by authorized transfers for various current operations, less the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed, appropriation for prior year overdraft, and gain on sale of tax acquired property.

DEBT FUND The debt fund, incorporated in the balance sheet as a separate fund, reflects outstanding fire truck notes of \$9,600.00 which are to be retired from future revenue.

TRUST FUNDS The total amount of trust fund principals was \$9,430.00 and unexpended income amounted to \$711.43 at the year end. With the exception of the ministerial and school fund of \$1,605.00 and the Simpson Memorial Library Fund of \$1,000.00, the trust funds were on deposit in the Bangor Savings Bank, Bangor, Maine.

DEPARTMENTAL ACCOUNTS The departmental accounts showed an increase of \$3,530.09 in funds raised by taxation, as compared with the preceding year. Larger appropriations for highway and education were the major factors responsible for the increase.

GENERAL Transfers of \$5,700.00 from excise taxes and \$9,598.00 from surplus for current operations were authorized by the townspeople at the annual and special town meetings.

It is recommended that the treasurer deposit town monies more frequently; also, that all expenditures of town funds be made by check.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

The system of internal control was reviewed as pertained to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. Count of cash was made and reconciled with current receipts and petty cash funds.

Cash accounts were verified by reconciliation of bank statements and/or bank confirmation. An analysis was made of receipts and deposits as well as expenditures and negotiated checks. Vouchers, payrolls, and canceled checks were examined for a selected period.

Verifications were utilized, on a test basis, to determine the correctness of recorded assets and liabilities. Excise tax collections were compared with copies of receipts retained by the collector. Debt and trust fund transactions were examined. Surety bond coverage was reviewed.
