REPORT OF SELECTMEN AND TOWN MANAGER

To the Citizens of Carmel:

The Board of Selectmen and Town Manager respectfully submit the following report of activities for the year ending December 31, 1970.

1. Town Road Improvement—an additional $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile of new construction was completed on the Five Road.

2. State Aid Construction—the money raised for 1969 and 1970 was applied to additional new construction on the Hinckley Hill Road.

3. Cutting Bushes—this year more bushes were cut at Irish Road four corners, Five Road four corners, and along Fuller Road.

4. Town Dump—Douglas Small has done a fine job of keeping the dump pushed back and burned. Poison was applied and gravel hauled in when needed, at his expense.

5. Town Road Tar—due to the lack of being able to get the bituminous material, no tarring was done this year.

6. Permanent Bridge Fund—as voted last year, \$1,000.00 was transferred from this account to Town Roads and Bridges. This leaves \$520.38 in this account.

7. Salt and Sand—since we had some sand left over from last year, only 600 additional yards were stockpiled this fall.

8. Cemeteries—the Highland Cemetery was surveyed, maps drawn of the new section and all lots staked out. The North Carmel Cemetery addition was bulldozed and cleared. We hope to get this staked out and fenced this spring. The fencing has been purchased.

The Town Office is open Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., on Tuesday and Thursday from 9:00

a.m.. to 12:00 a.m., and on Monday evening from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

The Selectmen meet at the town office Monday evenings at 7:30 p.m. Any suggestions for the good of the town are welcomed.

The public health nurse gave fifty-five tuberculin tests to the kindergarten and seventh grade pupils in January 1970 and ninety-five tuberculin tests were given to the same grades but to different children in September 1970. There were no skin reactors found.

The physician administered rubella vaccine to 219 school children in kindergarten through the fifth grade. At a special clinic for preschool children seventeen children had rubella vaccine. The nurse coordinated both clinics.

Home visits were made by the nurse to individuals referred by physicians, families, and school personnel to give preventive, therapeutic and rehabilitative services.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

The system of internal control was reviewed as it pertained to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. Cash accounts were verified by reconciliation of bank statements and/or bank confirmation.

An analysis was made of receipts and deposits as well as disbursements and bank charges. Vouchers, payrolls and canceled checks were examined on a selective basis. Letters of confirmation were used on a test basis to verify the correctness of recorded assets and liabilities.

Revenue accruing to the municipality from various sources was reviewed and checked to pertinent records. Records of town and selectmen's meetings, as they pertained to financial matters, were checked. Debt and trust fund transactions were reviewed and investments verified. Surety bond coverage was determined.

COMMENTS OPERATIONAL RESULTS

The fiscal year's operations showed that a net unexpended departmental balance of \$14,988.11 was lapsed to the unappropriated surplus, per the following summary:

The balance of excise tax revenue, the overlay and unexpended balances in highway and the contingent accounts less an overdraft in the aid to dependent children account were the major factors contributing to the amount lapsed to surplus.

* * *

The following comments pertain to the accompanying financial statements:

ASSETS The general fund cash balance totaled \$41,096.00

at the year end. The bank balances used in reconciling this amount were confirmed by the depositories. Petty cash was counted.

Accounts receivable of \$3,357.21 consisted principally of the balance due from the U. S. Government for federal disaster relief.

Taxes receivable totaled \$24,876.00 of which \$23,789.13 represented current year accounts. The remaining balance of \$1,086.87 was for unpaid accounts dating from 1965. Tax liens and tax acquired property amounted to \$4,531.93 and \$2,467.12 respectively.

LIABILITIES, RESERVES AND SURPLUS Accounts payable of \$3,285.24 were for services in connection with federal disaster relief work.

The departmental accounts showed an unexpended balance of \$5,544.69 carried forward to the ensuing year in accordance with legal requirements and/or customary practice. It is suggested that the voters stipulate annually the operating accounts, except those which are required by law to be carried, that are to be reserve for the ensuing year.

Other reserves included trust funds being held pending acceptance and tax acquired property rentals which are to be applied to future property purchases.

The unappropriated surplus amounted to \$63,132.65, an increase of \$20,430.59 for the year. This change was occasioned principally by the net unexpended departmental balance lapsed and the gain on sale of tax acquired property.

TRUST FUNDS Trust fund principals totaled \$12,147.71 and unexpended income was \$972.59. With the exception of \$1,605.00 due from the general fund, the trust funds are on deposit in the Bangor Savings Bank.

GENERAL

The use of excise tax revenue to supplement appropriations by taxation for specific current year operations was authorized by the voters.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the excise tax receipts toward the following accounts:

Salt and Road Sand	\$2,000.00
Snow Removal	3,500.00
Town Road Tar	5,500.00
Town Roads and Bridges	1,000.00

Article 14. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Title 23, MRSA, Sections 1101, 1103, or 1104.

Selectmen \$1,066.00 Budget Committee \$1,066.00

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to pay State Wages for labor and trucks working on Town roads.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to fix a date when taxes shall be due and payable, and to set a rate of interest to be paid after that date.

Recommend November 30 and $\frac{2}{3}$ of one percent, a month.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote an abatement (discount) on taxes paid in full before a certain date, and to establish such rate of discount.

Recommend 3 percent discount on taxes paid in full within 30 days from date of billing.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the Town to sell and dispose of real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quit-claim deeds for such property.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following amounts of money and place them in trust, the interest to be used to maintain the following named cemetery lots:

Howard and Lillian Mason	\$ 50.00
Albion and Dawn Parsons	100.00
George Damon	100.00
Leonard A. Small	100.00

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise or appropriate the sum of \$1,605.00 for the Ministerial and School Fund to be placed in a trust account, the interest to be applied toward the school assessment.

Selectmen "yes"

Budget Committee "yes"

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to have the property maps brought up to date and raise or appropriate money for same.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to have the Surplus Food Program and, if so, to raise or appropriate money for same.

Selectmen "no"

Budget Committee—no recommendation

Article 23. Shall the following article constitute an amendment to the existing Carmel Zoning Ordinance?

“Article XVI, Section 1. **Individual Mobilehomes Prohibited:** No occupied trailer or mobile home shall be permitted in the Town of Carmel, except as provided in Article VIII, Paragraph 1, of this ordinance. No person shall maintain and occupy a mobile home in the Town of Carmel in any location other than within a duly licensed mobile home park.”

Selectmen recommend “yes”

Article 24. Shall the following article constitute an amendment to the existing Carmel Zoning Ordinance?

“Article XVI, Section 2. **Limitations:** Any extension, expansion or alteration of an existing mobile home or **Mobile Home Park** shall conform to this Ordinance.”

Selectmen recommend “yes”

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Credit Reserve Account under the provisions of MRSA, Title 30, Section 5201, Sub. 3; which may be applied in periods of financial emergency to assist in continuing its normal operation without increasing the tax rate; and to see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise or appropriate therefor.

Selectmen recommend 5% of total commitment or a maximum of \$5,000.00.
