## Report of Selectmen and Town Manager

To the Citizens of Carmel:

We are certain that you have been watching the progress on the Recreation Fields. 1985 was a busy and productive year for the Recreation Committee. They worked very conscientiously to get the fields ready for use this coming spring. There is still more work to be done, but we feel confident that it will be accomplished before the ball season opens. We will need people to organize teams and work with the young folks. If you are interested in volunteering your services, it certainly would be appreciated. The Horseshoe Pits are available for the not-so-young, so, "pitch in" and have fun.

State Revenue Sharing Funds received in 1985 amounted to \$39,015.37. Last year's balance of \$4,257.52 made a total of \$43,272.89 available. \$40,213.52 was applied directly to taxes to reduce the tax rate. The balance of \$3,059.37 will be carried forward toward 1986 taxes.

Federal Revenue Sharing Funds received for the year amounted to \$22,262.00 and was placed in the Trust Fund at Heritage Bank. \$25,000.00 was spent for Town Road Tar as approved at last Town Meeting. Unless there are some changes, we cannot anticipate receiving any further revenue to this account after this year.

Fees collected by the Town Clerk for hunting and fishing licenses, dog licenses, marriage licenses, copies of births, deaths and marriages, etc., amounted to \$1,117.69. These fees remain with the Town.

The Municipal Agent collected a total of \$1,181.50 for vehicles registered at the Town Office. Boat Excise Taxes collected amounted to \$1,061.00. These fees all remain with the Town.

After approval and discussion at the Special Town Meeting, the Selectmen signed a thirty year agreement with Sawyer Environmental Recovery Facility for the disposal of our rubbish after 1989. The fee per ton will be \$12.00, plus one-half of the CPIA as determined in the greater Boston area. The contract is void if ~~PERC~~ does not build the facility in Orrington to burn the rubbish. **PERC**

Septic Sludge is still being handled, by contract, with Tom Frost Disposal Service at a cost of \$900.00 per year.

Town Reports were delivered again last year by the Boy Scouts. The Town contributed \$100.00 to their Troop. Thanks to all who were involved.

The Fire Department appointed a truck committee to select what they wanted for a new Fire Truck. Final specifications were agreed upon and a contract was signed by the Selectmen on April 1, 1985 with Middlesex Fire Equipment Service, Montpelier, Vermont, for the stipulated price of \$98,418.00. Delivery is expected prior to Town Meeting in 1986.

Our sincere thanks to all of the various boards and committees for their work on behalf of the Town.

The Town Office is open daily from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and on Monday evening from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., unless it is a holiday. The Selectmen meet each Monday evening at 7:30 p.m. If you plan to come in to discuss a particular subject, please try to let us know in advance.

## Carmel Recreation Committee Progress Report: 1985

To the Citizens of Carmel:

The past year has been busy and productive for your Recreation Program. I would like to give individual recognition to each person and organization that has helped with the project, but space does not permit me to list everyone and I wouldn't want to overlook any of the outstanding citizens who have donated their time and money in support of our effort. Please accept the sincere appreciation of the Recreation Committee for all that you have done.

We now have seven sets of horseshoe pits in operation. The first game was played in early July, 1985. Temporary lighting is installed for night games. One softball field and one baseball field are complete except for bleachers and dugouts. All fencing is in place on both fields and the grass has had a full season to become established on the playing areas. The parking lot is about 80% complete and should be useable before the first games. The picnic area will probably be the next useable part of the facility. Brush cutting has been progressing steadily. Some minor landscaping is all that remains to be done, when this is accomplished all we need is picnic tables and garbage containers. The committee has recognized the need for bathroom facilities on the grounds. Outhouse buildings are not the most appealing but they are the least expensive and the most feasible at the present time. We plan to have adequate facilities in place this spring.

A lot of thought and planning has been required to derive maximum use of the land that is available. Location and topography are ideal and we feel that Carmel will have one of the finest Recreation Parks in the State.

The committee has spent a lot of time discussing maintenance of the facilities. Our objective is to make the park self supporting as much as possible. # Report of the Road Commissioner

To the Citizens of Carmel:

The Town received \$48,397.50 from the State Local Road Assistance Program in 1985. A balance of \$8,922.99 was carried forward from 1984, making a total of \$57,320.49 available for use on Town Roads. From this amount, we spent \$29,754.96 for hot-top on the Fuller Road and Pomeroy Road, and \$2,058.00 for cutting and removing shoulders on the Cook Road and Marcho Road, and repairing culverts. Having the roadsides mowed all over Town cost \$1,025.00. On December 31, 1985, there was a balance in this account of \$24,482.23 to be carried forward for use this year. More construction and more hot-topping will be done on the Cook Road.

The Town Road Tar money, (\$25,000.00) appropriated from Federal Revenue Funds, was spent for hot-top on the Cook Road.

Bushes were cut on parts of the Cook Road and Fuller Road. Grading was done periodically on all of the dirt roads and calcium applied when needed. Normal maintenance was done on the dirt roads and patch was applied to the tar roads.

We anticipate finishing the gravel work on the Cook Road, Haskell Road, and Garland Road this spring.

The hot-top program will continue. We plan to re-do areas that need it the most in order to maintain the roads that are already tar.

My thanks to Robert Noyes and his crew and to the "McSorley Group" for their efforts in helping to maintain our Town Roads.

**NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**  
**YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1985**

**1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The accounting policies of the Town of Carmel conform to generally accepted accounting principles as applicable to governmental units.

**A. Basis of Presentation**

The accounts of the Town are organized on the basis of funds or account groups, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The operations of each fund are accounted for with a separate

set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund balance, revenues and expenditures. The various funds are grouped by type in the financial statements.

#### **Governmental Funds**

**General Fund**—The general fund is the general operating fund of the Town. All general tax revenues and other receipts that are not allocated by law or contractual agreement to another fund are accounted for in this fund. From the fund are paid the general operating expenditures, the fixed charges and the capital improvement costs that are not paid through other funds.

**Special Revenue Fund**—Special revenue funds are used to account for revenues derived from specific taxes or other earmarked revenue sources, including federal revenue sharing funds.

#### **Fiduciary Funds**

**Trust Funds**—Trust funds are used to account for assets held in trust by the Town for others.

### **B. Basis of Accounting**

The modified accrual basis of accounting is followed by the governmental funds. Under the modified accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recorded when received in cash except for property tax revenues which are recorded as deferred tax revenues unless collectible within sixty days following the year end. Expenditures, other than interest on long-term debt, are recorded when the liability is incurred.

### **C. General Fixed Assets**

The Town does not maintain a record of its general fixed assets. Expenditures for property and equipment are charged against departmental operations whenever such items are purchased.

## **2. Property Tax**

The Town's property tax for the current year was levied July 8, 1985 on the assessed value listed as of April 1, 1985 for all real and personal property located in the Town. Taxes were due October 31, 1985 with interest at 13.2% on taxes paid after the due date.

## **3. Deferred Tax Revenues**

The National Council on Governmental Accounting (N.C.G.A.) Interpretation No. 3 requires that property tax revenue be recognized to the extent it will be collected within sixty days following the year end.

To comply with this, as of December 31, 1985, the deferred tax revenues amounted to \$47,725.10 which reflected a decrease of \$5,542.33 of the prior year's balance.

**4. Deferred Credits**

Deferred credits represent items received during the current accounting period but to be used as revenue in the subsequent year. These accounts were as follows at December 31, 1985:

**5. Pension Plan**

Eligible Town employees are covered under the Social Security System. The Town's contribution to the Social Security System was approximately \$1,610.00.

**6. General Fund Budget**

The Town operates on a net budget as compared with a gross budget. All revenues are not estimated, but are credited to the particular operating account. Certain revenues are dedicated for particular purposes by vote of the townspeople at the annual Town meeting or at special Town meetings.

At the annual Town meeting, held in March of each year, the townspeople vote on various articles, on which amounts for appropriations have been recommended by the Board of Selectmen and/or the Budget Committee.

**7. Designated for Capital and Special Reserves**

Capital and special reserve accounts, for various purposes, have been established in the past by statutory provisions or by vote of the townspeople. These accounts, amounting to \$54,909.51 on December 31, 1985, were invested in time deposits, a certificate of deposit and repurchase agreements.

**8. Designated for Subsequent Year's Expenditures**

Historically, the townspeople vote to carry certain departmental unexpended balance and/or overdrafts forward to the following year for expenditures. This is usually in lieu of additional appropriations in any particular account.

**10. Vacation/Sick Leave Accruals**

The accruals for the Town of Carmel are not material and need not be disclosed.

### 11. Trust Funds

Trust funds of \$17,692.63 for cemetery perpetual care, library and school and ministerial purposes were held in trust by the Town. This amount, which represents principals of \$13,697.71 and unexpended income of \$3,994.92, was invested in time deposits and a repurchase agreement.

### 12. General

The use of excise taxes, transfers from surplus and federal revenue sharing funds for current year operations were voter authorized. The townspeople also authorized the selectmen the use of highway block grant funds as they deemed necessary.
