



FROM CODE ENFORCEMENT

PLEASE NOTE - Carmel has NO minimum square footage to require a building permit. If you are building or installing a shed, deck, mini barn or any structure, please contact me to obtain a permit.

SEXTON OF CEMETERIES

We started selling lots/plots in section "W" this past year. The price is still \$125 per lot, for residents which is five feet by ten feet. There are still some lots/plots available in section "V" but the old sections of Highland are just about all owned.

Please follow the Cemetery Ordinance. Especially Section 6 #5: "Permitted and Prohibited Activities: Lot owners may improve, cultivate and care for their lots and existing trees, shrubs and plants in accordance with the ordinance and may set out in sound wood, concrete or metal containers plants or flowers of such kind or size as to not interfere with the adjacent lots. Owners shall not change the grade of any lot or interfere in any way with the general plan of landscaping of cemeteries nor add any material to his/her lot which is considered by the sexton to be unfit for the cultivation of grass." (No Stone)



Again, this year the uncontained silk/plastic flowers make it impossible to weed whack around the stones without clipping off part of the flowers. Arrangements in lightweight and plastic containers are broken by the weed whacker, and wreaths should be securely attached to the headstone. Any arrangement that inhibits or is damaged during the maintenance of the cemeteries may be removed by the maintenance crew. We greatly appreciate your attention to these matters and helping us to keep our cemeteries looking attractive and peaceful.





PAPER, PLASTIC, METAL & GLASS can all be mixed together.

PAPER

- All Clean Cardboard, Paperboard & Pizza Boxes
- Newspapers & Inserts
- Magazines
- Mail & Catalogs
- Paper Bags
- Office Paper & Envelopes
- Wrapping Paper
- Phone Books
- Hard Cover Books
- Paper Plates (*clean*)
- Milk & Juice Cartons
- Drink Boxes & Aseptic Containers
- Shredded Paper (put in clear bags)

PLASTIC

- Water Bottles
- Milk Jugs
- Detergent Bottles
- All rigid containers marked with a #1-#7 (except Styrofoam®)

METAL

- Tin Cans
- Aerosol Cans (empty)
- Aluminum Cans/Foil
- Pots & Pans

GLASS

- All glass Bottles & Jars (all colors, caps on)

All containers must be **EMPTY**, but not perfectly clean. A light rinse will do.

DON'T RECYCLE

Note Size:

Anything bigger than a 5-gallon  bucket is not recyclable.

No Large metal parts car, boat, truck, etc.
Wood/lumber
Propane, helium or other gas cylinders
Piping, plastic or metal
Clothing & shoes

Know Which Plastics to Recycle

With the exception of polystyrene (Styrofoam), your plastic is recyclable if the answer to all three of these questions is **YES**:

1. Does it have a number (1-7) in the middle of the chasing arrow symbol?

2. Is it rigid or hard?

3. Is it a container?



Many supermarkets & retail stores accept plastic bags and film for recycling. Find drop-off locations at plasticfilmrecycling.org.

No hazardous waste – ever!

The following items, categorized as "hazardous waste" must be disposed of carefully and cannot be included with your trash or with single-sort recycling:

- ✗ Ammunition
- ✗ Anti-freeze
- ✗ Button-cell batteries
- ✗ CFL light bulbs (compact fluorescent lights)
- ✗ Chemicals
- ✗ Computers & related parts
- ✗ Fertilizers
- ✗ Fluorescent bulbs (of any kind)
- ✗ Fuel (gasoline, diesel, kerosene)
- ✗ Mercury (in any amount)
- ✗ Oxygen tanks
- ✗ Paint thinner
- ✗ Pesticides
- ✗ Propane tanks
- ✗ Rechargeable batteries
- ✗ TVs

However, area transfer stations and recycling centers often offer programs to take this kind of waste.






Top 10 Ways to Be a Good Septic Owner

- ✓ Have your system inspected every three years by a qualified professional or according to your state/ local health department's recommendations
- ✓ Have your septic tank pumped, when necessary, generally every three to five years
- ✓ Avoid pouring harsh products (e.g., oils, grease, chemicals, paint, medications) down the drain
- ✓ Discard non-degradable products in the trash (e.g., floss, disposable wipes, cat litter) instead of flushing them
- ✓ Keep cars and heavy vehicles parked away from the drainfield and tank
- ✓ Follow the system manufacturer's directions when using septic tank cleaners and additives
- ✓ Repair leaks and use water efficient fixtures to avoid overloading the system
- ✓ Maintain plants and vegetation near the system to ensure roots do not block drains
- ✓ Use soaps and detergents that are low-suds, biodegradable, and low- or phosphate-free
- ✓ Prevent system freezing during cold weather by inspecting and insulating vulnerable system parts (e.g., the inspection pipe and soil treatment area)


